# Keyhole Scarf

## EXPERIENCE LEVEL

Intermediate

## MATERIALS

- Blue Sky Brushed Suri (50 g/142 yds): 1 hank
  - Size 13 needles
- Photo Shown: Whipped Cream #900

## GAUGE

In stitch pattern, 24 sts and 11 rows = 4"

## FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

5½" by 30"

## HERRINGBONE STITCH PATTERN

**Knit Pattern Row:** \*K2tog tbl and slip only the first stitch onto right needle, which leaves second stitch still on left needle; repeat from \* to last stitch, end with knitting the second stitch still on the left needle.

**Purl pattern Row:** \*P2tog and slip only the first stitch off onto right needle, which leaves second stitch on left needle; repeat from \* to last stitch, end with purling the second stitch still on the left needle.

## SCARF

Cast on 30 stitches.

Starting with a knit pattern row, work alternating knit and purl pattern rows until scarf measures 21". End with a knit pattern row.

## Keyhole opening, left side

**Next Row:** Work a purl pattern row across 14 stitches, p1, turn.

**Next Row:** Work a knit pattern row across 14 stitches, k1.

(You are now working on just left side of keyhole opening.)

Repeat last two rows 2 more times.

Work one more purl pattern row.

Break yarn and rejoin to remaining right side stitches at center of scarf.

## Keyhole opening, right side

Repeat as for left side of opening, but do not break yarn.

**Next row:** Work a knit pattern row across all stitches.

Work alternating knit and purl pattern rows until scarf measure 30", ending with a purl row.

Bind off in herringbone pattern.

Weave in all ends

**To block:** pin the scarf to approx dims with the right side facing down and gently block with a cloth using no pressure. 🐾
